Recently D. shared that J and R., an Ojibway couple, planned to be the pastor couple on the Whata Reserve, which is an Iroquois Reserve. This is definitely a first! However, the Sunday that J. and R. were to be installed as the pastor couple, the weather was so bad that the service had to be called off. Satanic opposition is very real and evident in this incident.

D. and T. are feeling weary and discouraged, but they plan to hold the installation when the weather is more suitable. Please pray fervently that this will go ahead as planned and that Satan's schemes will be thwarted. Also pray for a smooth transition and for good results when the gospel is preached.
